Coach's Code of Conduct

- 1. Care about the development of the players and the team as well as winning the game. Remember, players are involved in hockey for fun and enjoyment.
- 2. Be a positive role model to your players, display emotional maturity and be alert to the physical safety of players.
- 3. Be reasonable in your demand on the players' time, energy and enthusiasm. Remember that they have other interests
- 4. Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are appropriate for the age and ability of the players.
- 5. Develop team respect for the ability of opponents, as well as for the judgment of officials and opposing coaches.
- 6. Be generous with your praise when it is deserved; be consistent and honest; be fair and just; learn to be a more effective communicator and coach; don't yell at players.
- 7. Be prepared. Don't arrive at practices without a practice plan. Organize practices that are fun and challenging for your players. Familiarize yourself with the rules, techniques and strategies of hockey; encourage all your players to be team players.
- 8. Hold parents meetings to explain strategy and plans, and communicate clearly with players and parents as needed throughout the season.
- 9. Always follow the advice of a physician in determining when an injured player is ready to play again.
- 10. Be concerned with the overall development of your players.
- 11. Take into consideration the maturity level of the players when scheduling times and durations of practices and competitions.
- 12. Remember, to play the game is great, to love the game is greater.
